- B. They had a rebellious father.
- C. Their father was the cause of thousands of deaths.
- D. However, they didn't follow in their father's rebellion.
- E. (Ezekiel 18:20).

### II. Qualities of the Sons of Korah

- A. They didn't defend their father and rebel against God.
  - Churches/elders often have to deal with families and friends who will defend the indefensible.
  - 2. May we learn to defend God and His word in all things!
  - 3. (Psalm 19:9).
- B. Not only did they not rebel, they used their talents in God's service.
  - 1. (1 Chronicles 26:19).
    - a. Some were doorkeepers.
    - b. (Psalm 84:10).
  - 2. (Psalm 42, 44, 45,46,47,48,49,84,85,87).
    - a. Some were songwriters.
    - b. "As the deer..."
    - c. "Be still and know..."
