

If The Foundations Be Destroyed

(Psalm 11:3)

- Introduction:
1. The question raised in Psalm 11:3 transcends the immediate concerns of that time, and is as applicable today as ever.
 2. Let us examine what the righteous should do in the face of crumbling foundations.

I. The Righteous Should Acknowledge The Sovereignty & Presence Of God

- A. Note what David said immediately following his question (Psalm 11:4).
- B. (Revelation 4, 7) Business as usual in spite of persecution.
- C. We need to be reminded of the eternal perspective (Revelation 5:10; 20:4).
- D. (Psalm 139:7-12; Daniel 3:22-26; 2 Kings 6:17).
- E. While society may crumble, God's firm foundation still stands (2 Timothy 2:19).

II. The Righteous Should Pray

- A. (James 5:16).
- B. (Ephesians 3:20).
- C. (James 4:2) Could we "have not, because we have asked not"?
- D. (Genesis 18) Power of intercession.

III. The Righteous Should Call People To Absolute Truth

- A. (Judges 21:25) Everyone did that which was right in their own mind.
- B. (John 17:17).

IV. The Righteous Should Seek Proper Values

- A. (Ecclesiastes 12:13).
- B. (Matthew 16:26).
- C. If the foundations of society are beginning to crumble, the righteous, more than ever, ought to be pursuing the things that really matter, and not be consumed with trivial, temporal matters.

V. If the foundations be destroyed, the righteous should evangelize the lost.

- A. (2 Corinthians 5:17).
- B. If the foundations are being destroyed, the righteous need to ramp up their efforts to evangelize.

 2. (Habakkuk 1:3-4; 3:16-18).
 3. The foundations of our society are crumbling, but should not despair. Rather we should give diligence to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world (Matthew 5:13-15).
