# (Romans 1:14-17)

# Introduction: 1. Because all men are sinners (Romans 3:23), man's greatest need is the gospel (good news) of Jesus.

- 2. Consequently, as the apostle Paul begins his letter to the Romans, he boldly affirmed that he was prepared to unashamedly proclaim the gospel to the world (Romans 1:15-17).
- 3. In this lesson, I would like to bring to your attention one point from each of these three verses.
