(John 9:1-41)

Introduction: 1. God has used and continues to use people with disabilities to impart his will to men.

III. The Class Represented By The Blind Man

- A. He shared with others what Jesus had done for him (9:11).
- B. He boldly affirmed that Jesus was a prophet of God (9:17).
- C. He wasn't afraid what his peers would think or do (9:30-33).
- D. Though he suffered the consequence of his conviction, he also enjoyed the reward of his conviction (9:41).
- E. Are you like this blind man in faith and action?
