(Luke 13:6-9)

Introduction: 1. Christians must bear fruit if we expect to be acceptable to God.

- 2. But sometimes I think we have a very narrow scope of what bearing fruit entails.
- 3. This narrow vision has caused some to feel barren and unproductive.
- 4. The intent of this lesson is to demonstrate that we need to bear fruit and that we may bear more fruit than we realized.
