# Nicodemus: A Pharisee Worth Following

(John 3:1-16)

# Introduction: 1. Throughout the New Testament, the Pharisees were usually held up by the Lord as an example of hypocracy and a model of religious arrogance.

- 2. However, the Bible mentions one Pharisee by name who is an exception to the rule.
- 3. In fact, his life is worthy of imitation.
- 4. Although he is mentioned only three times in the New Testament, in each instance, he's worthy of our notice and imitation.

### I. Nicodemus – He Came To Christ

- A. (John 3:1).
- B. Why he came at night, nobody knows for sure.
  - 1. It may have been because he was afraid (John 12:42-43).
  - 2. It may have been totally unrelated to his fear.
- C. However, the very fact that he came to Jesus shows a great deal of humility.
- D. He also exhibited honesty (John 3:2).
- E. If one is to come to Christ today, he must possess humility and honesty.

## II. Nicodemus – He Spoke For Christ

- A. (John 7:50-51).
- B. Do we have the courage to stand before our peers and speak out for Jesus?
- C. While we cannot speak for the person of Jesus as Nicodemus was able to do, we can speak for the words of Jesus.
  - 1. The Plan of Salvation.
  - 2. The Uniqueness of the church.
  - 3. The Worship of the church.
  - 4. Purity of life expected of Christians.

#### III. Nicodemus – He Honored Christ

- B. Today, we can honor Christ by our words and our deeds.
- C. (Matthew 5:13-16).
- D. (Ephesians 3:21).
