What If Jesus Had Never Been Born? (Galatians 4:4)

- Introduction: 1. Do you remember the 1946 film classic, *It's A Wonderful Life*?
 - 2. Have you ever wondered what the world would be like if Jesus had never been born?
 - 3. Some like Friedreich Nietzsche, the 19th century German philosopher has considered this question, and has declared the world would be a much better place had Jesus never been born.
 - a. He was quick to point out the "sins of the church" as seen in the crusades, inquisition, and witch hunts.
 - b. According to Nietzsche, more people have been killed in the name of Christ than in any other name.
 - 4. However, such a view is untrue and distorted.
 - 5. Let's just imagine for a few moments what the world would be like if Jesus had never been born.

- A. Children opposes infanticide, and sacrifice; founded orphanages and foundling homes (Luke 17:1-2; Matthew 19:14).
- B. Women values her equally to her male counterpart (Galatians 3:28).
- C. The Elderly opposes euthanasia; founded homes for the aged (1 Timothy 5:1-2; Ephesians 6:2).
- D. Slavery opposes slavery (Ephesians 6:5-9).

II. Christianity's Impact On Various Areas Of Civilization

- C. Civil Liberties (2 Corinthians 3:17).
- D. Man's Value (Genesis 1:28).

Conclusion: 1. Jesus broke into history nearly 2000 years ago so that we could have an abundant life (John 10:10).

- 2. The world would be unrecognizable to us had Jesus never been born.
- 3. But the primary thrust of Jesus was not simply to enrich our lives on earth, but to save us from our sins so that we can share in eternal life.
