After The Resurrection

(Luke 24:13-43)

Introduction: 1. We have all probably imagined what it would have been like to have been present at the death of Jesus.

- 2. We have all probably been present at the foot of the cross, at least in our minds.
- 3. It's interesting to imagine what we might have done if we would have been present.
- 4. But in today's lesson, I don't want you to picture what you would have done at the foot of the cross on Friday, I want you to picture what you would have done sometime Sunday afternoon.

I. They Spoke Of What Had Happened Among Themselves

- A. (Luke 24:13-14).
- B. It's great to come together and "think out loud" with brothers and sisters in Christ.
- C. Such opportunities strengthen and enlighten us.

II. They Spoke Of What They Knew With An Outsider

- A. (Luke 24:15-20).
- B. Note that they didn't stop talking due to the presence of an outsider.
- C. (Mark 8:38)
- D. How often are we silenced due to being afraid of what others might think?

III. They Were Discouraged & Confused

- A. (Luke 24:21-24).
- B. Notice their honesty about their religious confusion.

III. They Allowed An Outsider to Teach Them

- A. (Luke 24:25-27).
- B. The answers they were seeking came from Scripture, not speculation, feelings, or opinions.

IV. They Were Zealous & Had To Share Their Knowledge

- A. (Luke 24:31-35).
- B. They had to tell they had a sense of urgency and excitement.

Conclusion: 1. We find ourselves in a very similar situation as these two disciples on the road to Emmaus.

- 2. We stand confronted with the resurrection of Jesus Christ.
- 3. What will we do with that information?
