## Don't Be Foolish

(Proverbs 3:35)

Introduction: 1. The Bible is a book of examples — some serving as patterns, while others serve as warnings.

- 2. (1 Corinthians 10).
- 3. In this lesson, let us examine the legacy of several foolish people and make some application to our own life.

## I. Ahithophel — A Legacy Of Self Spite

- A. (2 Samuel 15-17).
- B. Ahithophel was a trusted advisor to King David, whose judgment was highly respected (2 Samuel 16:23).
- C. However, he deserted David and followed Absalom in his rebellion.
- D. On one occasion, Absalom sought and rejected his advice.
- E. Thus, Ahithophel went home and hanged himself (2 Samuel 17:23).
- F. Do people in the church ever overreact when they do not get their way?
- G. Do people in the church ever hurt themselves to make a point?

## II. Nabal — A Legacy Of Disrespect

- A. (1 Samuel 25).
- B. Nabal refused to express proper respect to David for his protection and leadership he had provided.
- C. Nabal refused to respect David for who he was and what he had done for him (1 Samuel 25:10, 15-16).
- D. Do people in the church fail to honor and give the kind of respect due to our spiritual leaders?
  - 1. We owe our spiritual shepherds esteem (1 Thess. 5:12-13), submission & obedience (Hebrews 13:17), and protection (1 Timothy 5:19).

## III. Elymas — A Legacy Of Obstruction

- A. (Acts 13:6-13).
- B. Elymas attempted to obstruct the conversion of Sergius Paulus.
- C. Do Christians ever stand in the way of others obeying and living the Christian life?
  - 1. Through hypocrisy.
  - 2. Through words.
- D. (Luke 17:1-2).
