The Last Words of Jesus

(John 12:48)

Introduction: 1. I am always happy when people turn their attention to Jesus, and people do that very thing at this time of the year.

- 2. The birth of Jesus is an amazing truth That God would relinquish heaven and come to earth as a baby is captivating to say the least (John 1:1,14).
- 3. But this morning, I wish to take us beyond the manger.
 - a. I don't want to think of the babe, but of the man.
 - b. As a babe he was helpless; as a man he was all powerful.
 - c. As a babe he was loved; as a man he was hated.
 - d. As a babe he made demands on his mother; as a man he makes demands on all people.
- 4. This morning, I want us to consider the last words of Jesus.
- 5. Last words are important, especially when one knows they are one's last words.
- 6. Typically, we turn to the cross for the last words of Jesus, but let's go further, to the last words he actually spoke to us in Revelation 22.

II. I Am the Root & Offspring of David; The Bright and Morning Star

III. Blessed Is He Who Keeps The Words of this Prophecy

- A. (Revelation 22:7).
- B. Jesus affirms man's need for obedience, and the blessings that follow.

IV. Behold I Come Quickly

- A. (Revelation 22:7,12,20).
- B. Jesus affirms the suddenness of his return.

V. I Will Reward Everyone According to His Work

- A. (Revelation 22:12).
- B. Jesus affirms that there will be a judgment.
- C. (Acts 17:30-31).
- Conclusion: 1. The last words of Jesus remind us of who he is; that he expects obedience; and that he's coming again to judge the world.
