Get Real

(Matthew 22:34-40)

Introduction: 1. This lesson is intended to emphasize the need for authentic Christianity.

2. Many people play at being a Christian, but it's not genuine.

I. How Would You Identify Yourself?

- A. If you were asked "who are you?" how would you respond?
- B. If someone else where to try to identify who you are, how would they respond?
- C. (Matthew 5:13-16; Joshua 24:15; 1 Kings 18:21).
- F. Let's quit playing and be authentic and be disciples of Jesus.

II. Don't Deceive Yourselves

- A. It's easy to pretend to be a Christian, especially those of us who have been raised up going to church.
 - 1. We sometimes equate attendance with faithfulness.
 - 2. We sometimes equate activity with spirituality.
- B. We must be careful that we don't deceive ourselves by our own pretense.
- C. A disciple is one who loves God with all his heart (Matthew 22:34-40).
- D. Don't confuse walking in the same direction as Christ with following Him.

III. Being Authentic Is Liberating

- A. Being two different people is difficult to manage.
- B. Deciding to be a disciple frees you of worrying about what you say or how you act around certain circles of people.
- C. And God knows the difference (2 Chronicles 25:2; 1 Chronicles 28:9).

IV. Being A Christian Isn't What We Do, But Who We Are

- A. This will affect the way we live and the way we interact with others.
- B. Our responsibilities won't be tasks to perform, but rather just a way of life.
- Conclusion: 1. If you're pretending to be a disciple of Jesus, give up the pretense.
 - 2. God knows the difference, and usually so does everyone else.
 - 3. Let's be authentic so that we can lead people to Christ by our example, and not turn them away by our hypocrisy.
