Weightier Matters

(Hosea 6:6)

- Introduction: 1. Some people may be shocked to learn that not everything in the Bible contains the same weigh or importance.
 - 2. While all of God's word is true and important, not all of God's word is equally important.
 - 3. You might say that in order to be a good Christian, we must engage in a little "biblical triage."
 - 4. Let's take a look at a passage which teach us some of the weightier matters of the law.

I. The Principle Illustrated

- A. (Matthew 23:23).
- B. (Leviticus 10:1-20).

II. Hosea 6:6

- A. Mercy Over Sacrifice.
 - 1. One cannot find favor with God while mistreating his fellow-man.
 - 2. In other words, it takes more than going to church to please the Lord.
 - 3. (Luke 10:30-36).
 - 4. How can we, who have been forgiven so much, fail to be merciful to others?
 - 5. (Matthew 18:21-35).
 - 6. (James 2:13).
- B. Knowledge Over Worship/Burnt Offerings.
 - 1. Is this surprising? It seems to me that people act as though the opposite is true.
 - 2. (2 Peter 3:18).
 - 3. Do your life demonstrate that you understand that knowledge of God and his word is a weightier matter?
 - 4. How well do you know your Bible?
 - a. Could you tell me what these books are about (Naham, Amos, Obadiah, 3 John)?
 - b. Could you tell me who these biblical characters were (Ahimelech, Athaliah, Kohath, Nabal, or what about Agabus, Simeon, Sergius Paulus, or Demetrius)?
- Conclusion: 1. The point of this lesson is not to suggest that we can leave undone the "lesser" things Jesus tells us we cannot do that (Matthew 23:23).
 - 2. The point is to help us to prioritize and focus on the right things or to say it another way, to help keep us from majoring in minors.
 - 3. This morning, we've discussed two things, mercy and knowledge, which God says are majors. The question remains how you will treat them.
