# Why The Bible?

(2 Peter 1:16-21)

Introduction: 1. The time comes for all of us when we must answer one of the most important questions we must ever answer.

- 2. That question is, "Why do you believe the Bible?"
- 3. Let's consider that question briefly this morning.

#### I. Inadequate Answers

- A. "It's the way I was raised."
- B. "Look at how it's changed my life."

#### II. Peter Offers Reasons To Believe

- A. (2 Peter 1:16-21).
- B. The Bible is a collection of reliable historical documents.
  - 1. (2 Peter 1:16).
  - 2. Don't minimize the word, "collection."
  - 3. 66 books, approximately 40 writers, 3 continents, 1500 years.
- C. There were eyewitnesses to the contents of the Bible.
  - 1. (2 Peter 1:16-18).
  - 2. (1 John 1:1-4).
- D. Written during the lifetime of other eyewitnesses.
  - 1. (2 Peter 1:18).
  - 2. (1 Corinthians 15:3-8).
  - 3. (Acts 2:22).
- E. Fulfills specific, detailed, prophecies.
  - 1. (2 Peter 1:19-21).
  - 2. (Isaiah 53).
  - 3. (Psalm 22).

### III. Objection Sometimes Offered

- A. "I'd believe it, if you could prove it to me scientifically."
- B. This has a ring of intellectualism, but it rings hollow.
  - a. The scientific method observable, measurable, and repeatable.
  - b. You can't do that with history!
  - c. You don't use the scientific method to validate history.
- C. To validate history, you examine the evidence.

## Conclusion:

- 1. And that brings us back to the Bible being a collection of 66 book, written on three continents, by 40 authors, spanning 1500 years, written by eyewitnesses during the lifetime of other eyewitnesses, fulfilling supernatural prophecies.
- 2. The Christian does not have a blind faith, but one based upon sufficient and compelling evidence.
