- Introduction: 1. Our culture needs a "hero."
 - 2. It's disconcerting to see the men and women who are held up before us today as heros and role models.
 - 3. We need to spend as much effort in creating awe and wonder in Jesus as we do in sports figures and entertainers.
 - 4. There is no one who comes close to being as heroic as Jesus.
 - 5. He challenges our compassion, our courage, our convictions, and our ethics.
 - 6. In this lesson, let's examine a typical day in the life of Jesus, recorded in Luke 7, and challenge ourselves to follow in his footsteps.

- B. Jesus has an encounter with a centurion who needs his help.
- C. The centurion shows great humility and trust in Jesus' power to cure his servant.
- D. Jesus cures this man's servant, but not before publicly complimenting him.
- E. (Proverbs 3:27).
- F. (Romans 14:19).

II. Jesus Had Compassion For People

- A. (Luke 7:11-17).
- B. Jesus had compassion on a widow lady who lost her only son, so Jesus raised him from the dead.
- C. The response of the people "God has visited us."

III. Jesus Cared For People

- A. (Luke 7:36-46).
- B. While Simon could only see a sinful woman, Jesus was able to see much more than that.
- C. There is so much more to the people that we encounter than what is on the surface.

IV. Jesus Changed People

- A. (Luke 7:47-50).
- B. Jesus took this sinful woman and changed her into a righteous woman.
- C. He still changes people today.
