## The One Not Chosen

(Acts 1:16-26)

- Introduction: 1. How well do you remember Shammua or Gaddi?
  - 2. How well do you remember Joshua and Caleb?
  - 3. How well do you remember Matthias?
  - 4. How well do you remember the other man who was considered to take the place of Judas?
  - 5. It's this man, Joseph Barsabas that I would like for us to think about this morning.
  - 6. And as we consider the events that occurred to him, we can easily interpose our lives into his story as well.

## I. The Background

- A. (Acts 1:16-26).
- B. Judas has betrayed Jesus and committed suicide.
- C. Consequently, the Lord needed someone to fill his office.
- D. Two men were proposed: Joseph Brasabas and Matthias.
- E. They prayed, cast lots, and Matthias was selected.
- F. But have you ever wondered what happened to Joseph Barsabas?

## II. What Could Have Happened

- A. He could have gotten angry and become bitter (Ephesians 4:31).
- B. He could have murmured or listened to the murmuring of others (Philippians 2:14).
- C. He could have allowed his hurt and disappointment to destroy himself.
- D. What about us? How do we handle hurt and disappointment?

## III. What Should Have Happened

- A. He should have realized that though he was not chosen to be an apostle, he was still chosen to be God's child!
  - 1. (Ephesians 1:4; 1 Peter 2:9).
  - 2. (Numbers 16:9-10; Romans 16:23).
- B. He should have rejoiced with those who rejoiced
  - 1. (Romans 12:15).
- C. He should have learned the discipline of submission.
  - 1. (Hebrews 5:8).
  - 2. (Hebrews 13:17; Romans 13:1; Colossians 3:22).
- Conclusion: 1. May God help us to overcome our disappointments when they come our way.
  - 2. And may we instead realize all the blessings we have in Jesus!
