(Psalm 46:1-10)

Introduction: 1. The Bible affirms, and we confirm that all men are guilty of sin (Romans 3:23).

- 2. Consequently, we need a Savior and a safe place of refuge.
- 3. God, being the benevolent God he is, has always provided a place of refuge for his children.
- 4. Let's consider the refuge he has offered in the past, is offering right now, and whether we have taken advantage of his offer.

I. In The Ark

- A. (Genesis 6-8).
- B. God planned to discipline the world for its wickedness.
- C. But he provided a place of refuge for the faithful.
- D. Only those in the ark were saved, and all outside of the ark were destroyed.

II. In The House

- A. (Exodus 12).
- B. God planned on delivering the children of Israel out of Egyptian bondage.
- C. Unless one was in the house where the blood had been applied, the firstborn would died.

III. In Rahab's House

- A. (Joshua 2:12-24; 6).
- B. Jericho was going to be destroyed.
- C. But those in Rahab's house would be spared from the destruction.
- D. If they left the house, they would be killed, but if they remained inside, they would find refuge.

IV. In The Cities of Refuge

- A. (Joshua 20).
- B. God made provision for those whose lives were in danger through being responsible for accidental death.
- C. Here they would be safe from the "avenger of blood."
- D. However, if they left the city, their life was in peril.

V. In Christ

- A. All spiritual blessings (Ephesians 1:3).
- B. New creature (2 Corinthians 5:17).
- C. Reconciled to God (Ephesians 2:16).
- D. Blessed in death (Revelation 14:13).

Conclusion: 1. Are you in Christ today.

- 2. It's the only place of refuge today.
- 3. Here is how you enter that refuge (Galatians 3:26-27).
