# Do I Need To Be Baptized Again?

(Acts 19:1-7)

Introduction: 1. Baptism is a significant event in the Christian faith, and cannot be taken lightly.

- 2. Consequently, people give a lot of thought to baptism and that thought causes many to question whether they were "scripturally baptized."
- 3. So the question is often raised, "Should I be baptized again?"
- 4. In this lesson we will seek to answer that question.

## I. Biblical Precedence For Being Baptized Again

- A. (Acts 19:1-7).
- B. Those who were baptized with an "outdated" baptism, were commanded to be baptized again.
- C. It would be comparable to having an expired ticket to a basketball game that was played a week earlier, and trying to use it to gain access into a subsequent game.
- D. This became a rather significant question during the early 1800's (Alexander Campbell and John Thomas) as well as the late 1800's (Gospel Advocate and Firm Foundation).

### II. When Not To Be Baptized Again

- A. When one learns more and matures.
  - 1. (1 Peter 2:2).
  - 2. Knowledge and spiritual growth should be daily events in a walk with Jesus, but that doesn't mean we should be baptized every day.
- B. When one feels guilty for sins following his baptism.
  - 1. (Acts 2:36-38).
  - 2. (Acts 8:13-24).
  - 3. For a Christian to be baptized to receive forgiveness of sins is just as ineffective as a Non Christian praying to receive forgiveness of sins.

#### III. When To Be Baptized Again

- A. When one engaged in the wrong mode (Romans 6:4).
- B. When one was baptized for the wrong reason (Romans 6:17; Colossians 2:12; Acts 2:38).
  - 1. My friends were all doing it.
  - 2. I wanted to please my parents.
  - 3. I did it while not understanding it was for the remission of my sins.

#### Conclusion:

- 1. Do you need to be baptized into Christ?
- 2. Do you need to be "baptized" again?
- 3. If you do, don't delay. Obey the Lord today. Delay is the same as saying, "No" to the Lord.
