(Mark 4:33-41)

Introduction: 1. This passage records another amazing miracle performed by the Lord.

- 2. However, rather than focusing upon the miracle, the intent of this lesson is to consider a particular phrase, "they took him as he was."
- 3. Are we willing to take Jesus "just as he is?"

I. Many Are Unwilling to Take Jesus Just As He Is

- A. Many attempt to fashion Jesus/God to their liking.
- B. How many times have we heard people say, "That's not what my Jesus would do?"
- C. God said, "Let us make man in our image and after our likeness" (Gen. 1:26), but since then, it has been man who has said, "Let us make God in our image and after our likeness."
- D. (Romans 1:25).
- E. (Isaiah 53:1-12; John 1:11; 1 Corinthians 1:22-24).

II. What Taking Jesus Just As He Is Means...
