 - 3. In order for that to ever be true, we must learn to be for what he was for and to be against what he was against.
 - 4. Therefore, I want this church to be known for being a "friend of sinners."

 - 3. To be okay with the marginal means you must also be okay with others marginalizing you too (Luke 7:39).
- B. Aim to love and not be liked.
 - 1. (1 Timothy 1:5).
 - 2. Remember, Jesus wasn't liked, he was crucified.

III. Do We Need To Improve?

- A. How do we act when we are with or around sinners?
 - 1. Are we ever judgmental?
 - 2. Are we ever rude?
 - 3. Do we ever ignore or try to distance ourselves from them?
 - 4. Or do we see them as a lost soul needing help?

- 2. Let's allow him to challenge us and get us out of our ruts.
