(John 3:16)

Introduction: 1. In this short series, we wanted to remind ourselves of a few of the qualities possessed by the God we serve.

- a. He Listens.
- b. He Leads.
- c. He Loves.
- 2. In this morning's lesson, I want us to consider one of the most talked about and most misunderstood character traits of God His Love.
- 3. There is no question that God loves us, but just what does that mean?
 - a. Will "Love Win" in the sense that Rob Bell wrote about in his book by the same title?
 - b. Does his love include discipline?
 - c. Does his love have limits?

I. The Extent of God's Love

- A. (Romans 5:6-11).
- B. (Revelation 22:17) Whosoever wills.
- C. This is why we sing, "Amazing Grace!"
- D. God loves all men, regardless of his deeds; but love and acceptance are not to be confused.

II. The Example of God's Love

- A. (John 3:14-16).
- B. Consider the significance of the little word, "so" in verse 16.
 - 1. This adverb can describe the "extent" of God's love.
 - 2. Or it can describe the "manner" of God's love.
 - 3. Contextually, I believe this passage describe the manner of his love.
- C. So what was God's love likened unto?
 - 1. The account of the brazen serpent (John 3:14-15; Numbers 21:4-9).
 - 2. God will punish those who sin.
 - 3. God made provision for his people.
 - 4. God stipulated a condition be met before they were healed.
- D. It's in this same manner God loves us today through the "lifting up" of Jesus upon the cross.

III. The Earnest of God's Love

- A. An "earnest" is a promise.
- B. After having given his one and only Son, is there any doubt that God is serious about our salvation?
- C. (1 Thessalonians 5:23-24).
- D. I'm not nearly as concerned about what happens next in life because I know what happens last (1 Corinthians 15:57-58).

Conclusion:

- 1. Don't ever forget just how much God loves you, and the way in which he loves you.
- 2. If you haven't properly responded to his love, you have that opportunity to do so today (John 14:15).
