# You Pick It: I'll Preach It

(2 Timothy 3:16-17)

- Introduction: 1. Tonight's lesson will examine a medley of several questions that were turned in; dealing generally with the state of the dead.
  - 2. It is our aim to answer them biblically and concisely, and to encourage you to open your Bible and see if my answers are correct.
  - 3. (Acts 17:11-12).

## I. Question One: Can The Dead See What's Happening On Earth?

- A. What we know about the afterlife is limited by what has been revealed to us.
- B. Beyond that is conjecture, which leads to division.
- C. Let's not go beyond what is written (1 Corinthians 4:6).
- D. I do know that the dead have remembrance.
  - 1. (Luke 16:27-28).
  - 2. (Revelation 6:10).
- E. Before I would affirm that the dead have ongoing knowledge of what is happening on earth, I would need Scripture affirming it, but to my knowledge, I have none.

## II. Question Two: Are The Dead Sleeping?

- A. There are passages that describe those who are dead as being "asleep."
  - 1. (Matthew 27:52).
  - 2. (1 Corinthians 15:51).
  - 3. (1 Thessalonians 4:14).
- B. However, these passages are describing death in terms of how it appears.
  - 1. It is descriptive of the body, not the soul.
- C. How do I know that?
  - 1. Moses and Elijah weren't in a state of sleep (Matthew 17:3).
  - 2. The rich man and Abraham weren't in a state of sleep (Luke 16:19-31).
  - 3. The martyred saints weren't in a state of sleep (Revelation 6:9-11; 20:4).
  - 4. Of what value would Paul's desire be if he were asleep (Philippians 1:23).
- D. While the dead may appear to us to be "asleep," the Bible teaches us that they are conscious in a spirit realm.

### III. Question Three: Can The Dead Come Back To Earth?

- A. The answer to that question is a qualified, "yes" and "no."
- B. We have several records of the dead coming back to the earth.
  - 1. Samuel (1 Samuel 28:3-25).
  - 2. Moses & Elijah (Matthew 17:3).
  - 3. But note: These instances were of God's doing, not the whim of living men or the dead.
- C. Jesus informs us that the dead may not return (Luke 16:27-31).

- D. I've heard many testimonies of people who claim to have received visitations from the spirit world, but consider this:
  - 1. Should we believe the testimony of Scripture, or the testimony of man (Romans 3:4)?
  - 2. If God wouldn't let a man return for the purpose of saving souls, then why would we think he'd let a man return to tell us where he placed the second set of keys to his car?

## IV. What Happens To Us When We Die?

- A. Again, the only way we can possibly answer this is if God has pulled back the curtain and allowed us a look.
- B. This is precisely what he did (Luke 16:19-31).
- C. The Bible teaches us that there will be a day of judgment that will occur after death (Hebrews 9:27).
  - 1. This is a "day" singular.
  - 2. This is a day that has been appointed (Acts 17:31).
  - 3. This day occurs when Jesus returns (2 Thessalonians 1:7-10; Matthew 25:31-32).
- D. While we know our bodies are buried and will decay when we die (1 Corinthians 15:35-49), what becomes of our spirit between death and the judgment that will occur when Jesus returns?
- E. The spirits of the dead go to Hades (Luke 16:23) to await the judgment.
  - 1. Part of this realm is called Paradise (Luke 23:43).
  - 2. The other parts is a place of torment (Luke 16:23; 2 Peter 2:9).
  - 3. Here, the righteous are comforted, and the wicked are tormented while they await the day of judgment.

#### Conclusion:

- 1. What we can conclude from all of this is that now is the time to prepare yourself for death (2 Corinthians 6:1-2).
- 2. And we have learned that if we wait too long, we can destroy ourselves.
- 3. In view of that, if you need to be reconciled to God, why don't you do so now?
