# You Pick It; I'll Preach It

# "Questions Concerning Salvation"

(1 Thessalonians 5:21)

### Introduction: 1. This lesson will close out our "You Pick It; I'll Preach It" series.

- 2. For the past seven weeks, I have been answering questions and preaching on topics that I've allowed others to pick.
- 3. Tonight's lesson will deal with questions that generally center on the issue of salvation and how man is saved from his sins.

#### I. What If A Man Dies Before Baptism?

- A. That's a fair question and worthy of consideration.
- B. First, we must acknowledge that the answer to this question must not be rooted in emotion, but rather in the word of God (John 12:48).
- C. (Proverbs 14:12).
- D. Note that if dying before being baptized is "emotive" proof that baptism isn't necessary for salvation; then why wouldn't dying before coming to faith be "emotive" proof that faith isn't necessary for salvation?
- E. (Acts 2:38; Mark 16:16; Acts 22:16).

#### II. What About The Thief On The Cross?

- A. Some suggest that since the thief was saved but wasn't baptized, then baptism must not be essential for salvation (Luke 23:43).
- B. First, how does one know the thief wasn't baptized by John (Mark 1:5)?
- C. Consider the nature of a will (Matthew 9:6; Hebrews 9:16-17).
- D. The thief on the cross wasn't baptized with the baptism of Jesus for the same reason Adam, Abraham, and Moses weren't The command wasn't given to them.

# III. Why Isn't Baptism Mentioned In Romans 10:9-10?

- A. Consider: Is the fact that baptism isn't mentioned in this passage proof that it is not necessary for salvation?
- B. What about other factors that aren't mentioned in this verse?
  - 1. Love for God.
  - 2. Repentance.
- C. The mention of some conditions does not exclude additional unmentioned conditions.

## IV. Can One Simply Call On The Name Of The Lord And Be Saved?

- A. Absolutely!
- B. (Romans 10:13).
- C. But what does calling on the name of the Lord entail?
- D. (Matthew 7:21).
- E. Let the Bible be its own best interpreter (Acts 22:16; 1 Peter 3:21).

Conclusion: 1. If you find yourself in need of salvation tonight, don't delay. Today is the day of salvation (2 Corinthians 6:2).
