How To Offer Criticism

(Galatians 6:1)

Introduction: 1. In Galatians, the mature child of God is instructed to offer criticism or correction to others when needed.

- 2. However, care must be given to offer this correction in the power way.
 - a. The danger is that we can destroy them with our words rather than help (Proverbs 18:21).
 - b. We can also destroy ourselves by the attitude we adopt when we do the correcting (Galatians 6:1).
- 3. The manner in which we speak to a person is often as important as the substance of what we say.
- 4. This lesson will offer suggestions that will help us to offer correction and criticism in the proper way.

I. Criticize The Action, Not The Person
