"Overlooked Lessons from the book of Jonah" (Jonah 1-4)

- Introduction: 1. The book of Jonah is probably one of the most well-known books of the Bible.
 - 2. Because it contains an incredible miracle, it has captured our attention and imagination.
 - 3. But in the midst of this book that contains this great miracle, there are some valuable lessons that are often overlooked due to the more obvious lessons contained therein.
 - 4. In this sermon, we will attempt to bright to light some of these often overlooked lessons from this great book.

I. The Great God We Serve

- A. (Jonah 1:2; 2:10; 4:11).
- B. The book of Jonah is not a book about a "great fish," it's a book about a "Great God!"
- C. He is a gracious God who loves the vilest of sinners.
- D. (Romans 5:8; 2 Peter 3:9).
- E. God's perspective is different and he sees compassion and love when maybe we can only see vengeance.

II. Disobedience Makes Things Harder

- A. (Jonah 1:3; 3:3).
- B. How much easier would our lives be if we hadn't stopped following God?
- C. (Proverbs 13:15).
- D. (Isaiah 55:9-10).

III. Trust in the Power of God's Word

- A. (Jonah 3:5-9; 4:2).
- B. While Jonah had a terrible attitude, he didn't doubt God or the power of his word.
- C. (Romans 1:16).

IV. Our Sin Drags Others Down With Us

- A. (Jonah 1:12).
- B. Our sins often entangle others as well.
- C. (Romans 14:7).
- Conclusion: 1. May these lessons that sometimes get "swallowed up" in the book of Jonah cause us to turn from our sins, and turn to the Great God of Heaven!
