The Christian & The Government

(Acts 4:1-31)

Introduction: 1.

- L. We are just two days away from electing a new leader for our nation.
- 2. Without question, this has been one of the most controversial elections in the history of our nation.
- 3. Never have two candidates been so disliked by both major parties.
- 4. The nation is polarized and it's possible that even some brethren may be polarized over politics.
 - a. Division is sinful (1 Corinthians 1:10).
 - b. Matthew the Publican and Simon the Zealot (Acts 1:13).
- 5. In this lesson, I want to establish this truth: Christianity will thrive when followers of Christ will refocus their attention away from what happens around us to what happens in us.

I. The Arrest

- A. (Acts 4:1-20).
- B. It's not always been as easy to be a Christian as it is now.
- C. Notice the boldness of these former "cowards"
 - 1. (Matthew 26:31).
 - 2. (Acts 1:9-12, 13, 19-21).
 - 3. Surely, the resurrection of Jesus made the difference.

II. The Release

- A. (Acts 4:21-22).
- B. They threatened and further threatened them (Acts 4:17-18, 21).
- C. Notice the corruption of the leaders (Acts 4:21).
 - 1. Peter and John heal a man who was lame for more than 40 years (Acts 3:1-8).
 - 2. Instead of praising them for healing this man, their inclination is to punish them (Acts 4:22).
 - 3. How corrupt is that?

III. The Prayer

- A. (Acts 4:23-31).
- B. Take careful note of that which they did and did not pray.
 - 1. They did not pray for a new form of government or a new leader; realizing the futility of governments (Acts 4:25-28).
 - a. Christianity doesn't need the right party in power to thrive.
 - b. Christianity doesn't need the right candidate to be elected.
 - 2. They prayed for boldness to speak God's word!
- C. This is what we ought to be praying for today.
 - 1. Maybe we should stop asking God to change the world.
 - 2. Maybe we should start asking God to change us!

Conclusion:

- 1. Take Courage!
 - 2. Don't allow the election to shake you.
 - 3. Remember, Christianity doesn't need the right party or the right candidate to thrive. It simply needs boldness exhibited in those who wear the name of Jesus!
