Focused Living

(1 Corinthians 15:58)

Introduction: 1.

- 1. The passage under consideration today is simply one-verse-long, but it is packed full of lessons for us to consider.
- 2. As we travel through life, we hear many voices calling for our attention, beckoning for our devotion, and consequently, it's easy to lose our way.
- 3. Paul concisely calls us to "stay the course," finish well, and closes by giving us hope.
- 4. Let's consider his words together.

I. Therefore

- A. One cannot study a verse that begins with the word, "Therefore," and not back up and examine the context.
- B. Some of the Corinthians were denying the resurrection (15:12).
- C. Paul made short work of that heresy and assured them there is life after death.

II. Be Steadfast & Unmovable

- A. As we experience life, we will find that there are times when various influences will push and pull us away from our commitment to the Lord.
- B. Demas (Colossians 4:14; Philemon 24; 2 Timothy 4:10).
- C. It's so sad to see people who were once faithful, give up before the finish line.
- D. (Job 1:

III. Always Abounding

- A. We are debtors to God's grace (Romans 5:8; John 1:16).
- B. Don't deceive yourself: A "do-just-enough" mentality won't get the job done (Matthew 22:36-39).
- C. Is your Christian walk characterized by "spurts" or by consistent faithfulness?

IV. The Work of the Lord

- A. The "work of the Lord" certainly includes the organized work of the church, but it involves so much more!
- B. (1 Corinthians 10:31).

V. Your Labor is not in Vain

- A. We might see everything we have ever worked for in this life destroyed through neglect or opposition.
- B. But God knows what you've done and will reward you accordingly (Hebrews 6:10).

Conclusion:

- 1. I want to encourage you to double down on your commitment to Jesus.
- 2. Life is too short to get discouraged, side-tracked, called away from an abundant life of service to Jesus.
- 3. In the end, we'll either be thankful we be thankful we served the Lord abundantly, or we'll wish we had.
