- Introduction:

  2. “Someday you’ll stand at the bar on high, Someday your record we’ll see; Someday you’ll answer the questions of life, What will your answer be? Sadly, you’ll stand if you’re unprepared, Trembling, you’ll fall on your knees; Facing the sentence of life or of death, What will that sentence be? (Tillit S. Teddlie).
