After Amen

(1 Thessalonians 5:17)

Introduction: 1. I find it amazing that so many of us struggle with our prayer life, when so many promises are connected with it.

- a. (1 John 5:14-15).
- b. (Mathew 7:7-11).
- 2. Someone once said that Jesus was more willing to go to the cross than we are to go to the throne of God in prayer.
- 3. While these things are true, the aim of this lesson is not to be another sermon encouraging you to pray, but is rather, a sermon on what to do after you pray.

I. After Amen – Live Obediently

- A. Have you ever considered that while you're waiting on God for an answer to your prayers, he's waiting on you?
- B. We can't manipulate God, like a child can sometimes manipulate his parents.
- C. (John 2:1-11).
- D. Maybe while we're waiting for God to answer our prayers, he's waiting for us to fill the jars.
- E. Live lives that are consistent with and in harmony with your prayers.
- **F.** When we pray for the church, our families, our marriages, our neighbors, we must then live lives consistent with our prayers if we expect God to answer.

II. After Amen – Trust the Sovereignty of God

- A. Prayer should be a relief and consolation to our souls.
- B. (Matthew 7:7-11) God will answer and he will give us what is good.
- C. (Romans 8:28).
- D. If we could embrace the fact that God sees the end from the beginning, we can more readily resign ourselves to his activities.
- E. This knowledge with create faith/trust and that will in turn create peace in the midst of our circumstances.
- F. What happens next is not nearly as disturbing when we know what happens last.

Conclusion: 1. If we need to improve our prayer life, let's do it.

- 2. When we don't pray, we miss out on so much (Ephesians 3:20).
- 3. This lesson is nothing new. It's simply a reaffirmation of what we have sung for years... "Trust and obey, for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey."
