(Jeremiah 8:20)

Introduction: 1. "Man of Sorrows, what a name for the Son of God who came, ruined sinners to reclaim, Hallelujah, what a Savior (Isaiah 53:3).

- 2. Jeremiah was known as the "weeping prophet."
- 3. One of his laments is recorded in Jeremiah 8:20.
- 4. The stubbornness of Judah has secured an impending judgment.
- 5. They've waited too long, and now there's nothing they can do.
- 6. Let's consider a few applications from this expression, "Summer has ended and we are not saved."

I. Why Were They Not Saved?

- A. The entire book of Jeremiah gives reasons, but let's take a look at what this chapter records.
- B. They would not repent (Jeremiah 8:6).
- C. They were perpetually backsliding (Jeremiah 8:3).
- D. They were not aware of God's judgment (Jeremiah 8:7).
- E. They rejected God's word (Jeremiah 8:9).
- F. They were not ashamed (Jeremiah 8:12).
- G. They were idolatrous (Jeremiah 8:19)

II. Impending Doom

- A. Because of their sins, they were going to be punished.
- B. They would endure hardship (Jeremiah 8:13).
- C. They would be deported as slaves (Jeremiah 8:19).
- D. They would seek healing, but they waited too late, and none would be found (Jeremiah 8:20, 22).

III. How Jeremiah Was Affected

- A. He was faint or depressed (Jeremiah 8:18-19).
- B. He mourned (Jeremiah 8:21).
- C. How does the condition of sinners affect you?

Conclusion:

- 1. The answer for the sinful people and for Jeremiah is the same: Trust in God.
- 2. If you need to turn back to God, resolve to do it today.
- 3. If you're depressed or vexed by the world in which we live, as Jeremiah was, trust in God, and dig in your heels, even if you must stand alone.
