#### Introduction:

## I. There was No Room for Jesus While He Dwelt Among Us.

- **A.** From the beginning of Jesus' earthly pilgrimage, we see that many had no room for him.
  - 1. His birth (Luke 2:7).
  - 2. Nazareth (Luke 4:16-29).
  - 3. Gadarenes (Mark 5:17).
  - 4. Judea (John 11:8).
- B. Time and time again, Jesus found that people had no room for him.

### II. There is Still No Room for Jesus in Many Places Today

- A. There is no room for Jesus in some churches today.
  - 1. While Jesus is head of the church, he is not recognized as the head in some churches? (Ephesians 1:22-23).

    - d. The Sinner's prayer (Acts 2:38; Acts 9:11; 22:16).
    - e. Human sexuality (Hebrews 13:4).

  - 1. Jesus has been driven out of our schools.
  - 2. Jesus has been forced out of our government.
  - 3. Jesus has been thrown out of our courts.
  - 4. The laws that are enacted
- C. There is no room in our hearts today.
  - 1. (Luke 6:46).
  - 2. Inward qualities that challenge us are often dismissed and excused rather than being embraced.
    - a. Forgiveness (Matthew 18:35).
    - b. Priorities (Matthew 6:33).
    - c. Holiness (Hebrews 12:14).
    - d. Love (Matthew 22:37-40).
