- A. (Acts 20:35) More blessed to give than to receive.
- B. (Ephesians 2:10) Created in Christ Jesus for good works.
- C. Paradox: The best way to lighten your own load is to bear the load of another.

II. Service Should Be Intentional

- A. (Colossians 3:23-24).
- B. So many inter-personal relationship problems could be solved if we could remember that we are serving the Lord, not the other person.
- C. What has Jesus ever done to you that would cause you to not serve him?
- D. We go to our jobs with a plan to work; do you have the same intentionality with Christianity?

III. Service Should Be with Humility

- A. (Philippians 2:1-4).
- B. (Matthew 5:16) Let your light so shine before men...
- C. Will we serve when no one sees, and no one knows?
- D. (Hebrews 6:10) God is not unjust to forget...

IV. Service Should Be Unstoppable

- A. (Luke 17:10) Still unprofitable servants.
- B. (2 Timothy 3:12) All who live godly will suffer persecution.
- C. (Job 1:9) Fear God for nothing?
- D. (2 Timothy 4:2).

V. Service is a Standard of Judgment

- A. (Matthew 25:31-46).
- B. Service is elevated to a Heaven or Hell matter.
- C. It is at the heart of the "Golden Rule" (Matthew 7:12).
